On June 7, 2025, the 15th annual Marine Corps League Detachment 1075 Mud Run will be held at the Jomeokee Park and Camp Grounds in Pinnancle, N.C., and we need your help!

The 5K course consists of more than 15 obstacles including: four mud pits, an ice pit, "Ho Chi Minh Trail", "Mount Suribachi rope climb/walk of shame", slip and slide, logs and tires, meat grinder, wooden walls and "A" frame climb, cargo net climb and grenade throw. On June 1, 2024, 1120 participants (37% increase from 2023) between the ages of 4 and 74, from 10 different states, navigated the obstacles and got "**dirty**" for a good cause. Although not may, if any, of us will physically take part in the MUD RUN, we can help financially. 100% of the donations made to this event stay within North Carolina, 85% stay within Forsyth or surrounding counties.

Funds generated from the event are used to support a wide range of charities including Wounded Warrior Battalion, East/Semper Fi-America's Fund, located at Camp Lejeune, N.C.; Toys for Tots; Veterans Helping Veterans Heal; Young Marines Youth Program; Veterans Home in Salisbury, N.C.; Wreaths Across America; The Hero Center and others.

<u>SURVIVING SPOUSE LIAISON – Jackie Kohler:</u> At the April Dinner Meeting we recognized Mrs. Nalyn Hipwood and Mrs. Peggy Wallace.

In September we will recognize Mrs. Diane Womack Boyer, Mrs. Nan Dewey and Mrs. Laura Wesely.

There is currently an effort to provide **additional compensation to Surviving Spouses** who receive Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC); the information is as follows:

Parity for Surviving Spouses: Increase Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)—a benefit for survivors of those who die in service or from service-connected conditions—lags behind other federal survivor benefits. DIC provides only 43% of what a 100% service-disabled veteran receives. Civilian federal survivor programs provide up to 55% of the employee's calculated retirement pay.

This inequity leaves military survivors with less support than their civilian counterparts, despite the sacrifices their loved ones made in service to our country. Contact your lawmaker today and them to champion this bill

LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS – Barry N. Moore, 2nd VP: MOAA urges all of us to take action (Legislative Action Center) on these four top legislative priorities:

• <u>Incentivize Military Spouse Hiring</u>: Actions to combat stagnant, high rates of unemployment among military spouses must include measures to incentivize their hiring. Cosponsor the Military Spouse Hiring Act to add a military spouse target group to the Work Opportunity Tax Credit program.

- <u>Unaccompanied Housing Improvements</u>: Transparency is key to supporting lawmaker oversight of this ongoing issue and addressing a \$137 billion maintenance backlog. Ask Congress to require DoD to make reports on unaccompanied housing installation conditions publicly available.
- <u>Ending the Wait for Toxic-Exposed Veterans</u>: Pass legislation to shorten how long millions of veterans must wait before receiving service-earned care and benefits.
- <u>Support Veteran Caregivers</u>: Champion/cosponsor the passage of the Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act.
 - TOP PRIORITY: Honor Veteran Caregivers Pass the Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act: Caregivers who provide daily care and support to aging and disabled veterans often sacrifice their own careers, financial stability, and personal well-being to fulfill their vital role. Many veteran caregivers rely on stipends classified as "unearned income," meaning they lose opportunities to save for retirement or contribute to Social Security. Caregivers also face major hurdles reentering the workforce after years of full-time caregiving, further jeopardizing their financial futures.
 - The Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act would help close these gaps by providing professional development, employment assistance, and retirement planning specifically tailored for veteran caregivers. This legislation is critical to ensuring caregivers receive the recognition, support, and financial security they have earned through their service to veterans.
